GUIDELINES ON THE PREPARATION OF REPORT CARD FOR SY 2020-2021

To: Public Elementary and Secondary School Principals/School Heads

- 1. To monitor learners' progress and to give awareness to the parents/guardians on the academic performance of their children, schools are expected to prepare Progress Report Card of individual learner.
- 2. In line with this, the following guidelines are to be observed in the preparation of individual report card:
 - a. A template by grade level attached hereto shall be used to observe uniformity;
 - b. Homeroom Guidance Learners' Assessment shall be included in the Report Card but not part of academic rating. Grades are just descriptive pursuant to the DepEd Guidelines issued by the Office of the Undersecretary for Curriculum and Instruction dated June 22, 2020; and
 - c. Computation of grades should be based from DepEd Order No. 8, s. 2015-Policy Guidelines on Classroom Assessment for the K to 12 Basic Education Program, and in accordance to DepEd Order No. 031, s. 2020 re: Interim Guidelines for Assessment and Grading that will be implemented this school year 2020-2021.
- 3. Teachers are encouraged to provide intervention activities, make possible adjustments in formulating Learners' Activity Sheets for those learners who have shown insignificant progress for them to improve performance.
- 4. The Progress Report Card should be issued to parents on time to encourage their active participation in guiding and supervising the learning of their children at home.
- 5. Immediate dissemination of this Memorandum to all concerned is enjoined.




