



MARAGOL INTEGRATED SCHOOL

The first School building of Maragol was constructed and started in 1930 through the administration of the late Lieutenant Celedonio Agduma. The school lot of one-hectare land was donated verbally only by the late MR. ADRIANO VIGEGA, one of the beneficiaries of Homestead Law of 1904.

In 1932 to 1935, a lady teacher from Guimba, Nueva Ecija opened a Private Primary School to accommodate the Grade I pupils but unfortunately, it lasted for three years only due some circumstances.

In 1938, the Government rented a house in Maragol and opened two classes for Grade I and Grade II pupils and two public school teachers were appointed.

In 1941, a Type -A School Building with two-classrooms was constructed for Primary School by the late incumbent Town Mayor Anastacio Tobias through his Pork Barrel Funds. This was

initiated through the extreme effort and full support of the Barrio Lieutenant Mario Apan. Few months after, another two classrooms were built for Grade III-VI pupils. Until, the primary school became a complete Elementary School in that same year.

Unfortunately, on December 8, 1941, an unexpected event had tremendously occurred, it was the bombing of Pearl Harbor in Hawaii and Forth Statesemberg in Pampanga by the Japanese Airmen. It resulted the Warfare of Japan and the United States of America. The outburst of World War II brought extreme fear to people everywhere. Many things were destroyed including schools.

After the World War II, people were backed to normal, but since the legal documentation of the school was not officially endorsed to the school, the Legal Documentation of the said property was later restated and reaffirmed by the late Don Eusebio Mendoza and the school building was demolished. Later, a Barrio Chapel was constructed and served the people spiritually.

In 1946, the chapel was converted into a classroom to cater the school children in Maragol.

In 1951, the Maragol Folks regained their dynamic effort and started to move on. The School opened classes with the help of

seven (7) teachers and one Teacher-in-Charge. They have organized the Parents- Teacher Association and also identified the different puroks in Maragol.

In 1960, the school building was reconstructed through the generosity of the late Town Mayor Dominador V. Santos in order to sustain the educational needs of the children in the barrio. Maragol Elementary School is located in Purok Laganap.

In April, 2013, the Division of Science City of Muñoz, School Head, Teachers and Barangay Officials of Barangay Maragol in coordination with the Local Government Unit of Science City of Muñoz proposed the Conversion of Maragol Elementary School into Maragol Integrated School.

In June 6, 2013, it was approved by the Department of Education with Government Permit (PHS) No. S-016, s. 2013 and granted authority to operate Grade VII of the Secondary Course.

Currently, Maragol Integrated School is catering the community two (4) grade levels in Secondary Level (Grade 7, 8, 9& 10).
