Palusapis Elementary School is one of the oldest schools in the Municipality of Muñoz based from the historical records and markers of the barrio which dated way back 1920. It is situated in the west of the Poblacion moreorless6kilometersindistance.Presently,it is composedofsixbuildings: one unit Bagong Lipunan Type, one Marcos Type, one HE Room Building, one Gracia Type, one unit Violago Type and one DepEd Building.

The schools as the educational government because of their haste desire to cope with the fast growing population and continuous progress of the place which will probably match the current situation. As a matter of material bases, is appropriate to show fame and distinction because of its background.

The school was believed to be founded a year after the enactment of Gabaldon Act which encourage education in the entirecountry. The Filipino teacher who originally pioneered in this school was Mr. Pedro

Emelia under an American Supervisorship of Mr. Glen J. Thomas. During that time Palusapiswas still a barrio of Sto Domingo, N.E. When there was a relocation of municipality jurisdiction, Palusapis was absorbed by the Municipality of Muñoz.

During this time, Mr. F. Sagun taught the one graded school from several years. When his terms of teaching lapse for unknown reason, Mr. A. Delos





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Santos succeeded him. He also taught in this school for several years. Thinking of more and contentment, he quit the places whereas Mr. B. Delos Santos was the one who took the position up to the year 1920.

The year 1936 marked the beginning of the historical period in the education of the barrio of folks of Palusapis when Mr. Vicente Morte was assigned in this school. Liking the place very much, he felt very free and got married to Reyes family, thereby considering himself as a bona fide resident of the place after all. With these circumstances, he did not seek for any transfer anymore instead served the barrio people honesty and faithfully. He worked hard devoting for the upliftment of the school. By so doing, he was admired by the barrio people. In the year 1938-1939, the single graded school was converted into a combination class. Luckily the following year, the school was given another chance to open a complete primary thereby giving additional teachers. Thistransitionperiodendedupto1941whentheSecondWorldWar brokeout.

During the Japanese Occupation, the school was completely closed. The only schools that remained functional were the schools in the town. This stagnancy lasted for four melancholies years until the period of Philippine Liberation from the Japanese Imperialism.

In 1946-1956, all schools in the municipality were centralized. This

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centralizationremaineduntiltheperiodofpeaceandorderintheentirecountry becausemostofthepeoplewereincarcerated inthetownduetothepresence of lawless elements that plunged elsewhere in the country. At the end of the sameyear, peaceand order prevailed in the whole country, and the country side peoplereturnedtotheirbelovedplacetherebyopeningtheschool, avearlater. It was then the beginning of the intermediate class under the head teachership of Mr. Alejandro Reyes (1946-1949). Because he was not from the place, he seek transfer to his home province of Pampanga. This instance gave opportunity to Mr. Arsenio Esusan to head the school (1949-1958). After nine years of good operation, the school was once again relegated into a primary due to the conflict that arise between him and the PTA President. The envious PTA President campaigned all relatives not to enroll in this school that caused very much to the decrease in enrollment. With this, Mr. Esusan was forced to transfer to San Antonio where he opened an IntermediateSchool.

AfterMr.Esusan,Mr.LemecitoCapiendowasassignedasTeacher-In- Charge (1958-1962). His administration did not last long for the reason of personal ease and convenience because a mutual agreement was made between him and Mr. Leonardo Santos who was then assigned in Gabaldon Primary School to swap post assignment. The following years, Mr. Santos was the head of Palusapis Primary School (1962-1964).





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Giving opportunity to the district to have a school expansion and teacher, the school once again opened as an Intermediate Class. Mr. EutiquioEstioko was assigned to head the school (1964-1968). He accepted willingly thinking of the opportunity after several years, but all his dreams were vain so he guit the job and decided to go to the United States of America.

The next assigned administrator of the school was Mr. Maximino Francisco (1968-1979). His incumbency of eleven years gave great improvement to the school because of his devotion to the work. However, his nice dream and plan were not fully accomplished because he was transferred to Maragol Elementary School due to the District Swapping Program.

ThenextteacherrelievingMr.FranciscowasMr.GregorioFernandez who was promoted as Principal of the school from 1979 to 1986. The following are the succeeding administrators of the school, to wit:


